Before start the meeting, the PCB addressed the Board. He emphasized upon the democratic setup of the board and opined that during the Board meeting, a healthy discussion should be done without any interruptions, with team spirit and bonhomie. The preparation of the agenda of any meeting and minutes of GC/CAC should be given adequate time available for discussion in a deliberate manner, inclusion of points (if any) of all members and scrutiny of all documents related to the agenda by all members before the meeting. During the discussion, PCB asked about demolition drive carried out by the Cantonment Board Agra and appreciated the same. It was also highlighted to take care of the humanitarian angle while taking out such drives. Sub-committee report should also be concluded. CEO told that during the meeting of committee and sub-committee, Member Secretary should be given due opportunity to present the fact of the matter and opinion.

**94. GRANT OF DEARNESS ALLOWANCE TO PENSIONERS OF CANTONMENT BOARD AGRA**

To consider and note U.P. State Govt. GO No. 29-2019.SA-3789/Das-2019-301/2000 T.C., dated 23-10-2019 conveying sanction for grant of Dearness Allowance to State Govt. pensioners w.e.f. 01.07.2019 @ 5%, total Dearness Allowance 17%.

The above GO is also applicable to the Cantonment Board Agra pensioners in accordance with Memorandum of Settlement 1969. The grant of D.A will involve additional expenditure of Rs. 3,88,182/- approx. per month to the Board. Necessary provision has already been made in the Budget.

The sanction of GO received vide Dte of Defence Estates, Central Command, Lucknow Cantt. Letter No. 49270/UP/DR/PENS/LCP/137 dated 14 November, 2019.

94. Considered and approved as per agenda. However, it was resolved that this payment be made according to priority wherein other previous liabilities of the board are duly covered.

95. **REQUEST FOR INSTALLATION OF CELL-ON-WHEEL TOWERS (COW), FOR FEASIBILITY TRIAL IN AGRA CANTT.: M/S INDUS TOWERS LTD**

To consider letter No.Nil, dt.13.11.2019 received from M/s Indus Towers Ltd. registered office at Building No.10, Tower A, 4<sup>th</sup> floor, DLF Cyber City, Gurugram, Haryana, vide which Head-Institutional Acquisition, UP West Circle, Indus Tower Ltd. has requested this office for grant of permission to deploy Cell on Wheel Tower at the following 11 locations/ sites, for enhancement of mobile networks on feasibility trial on Cost & Account of Indus Towers for at least one year which would help the Board towards identification, assessment and finalization of the required locations for further action in terms of the MoD Policy dt.26.02.2018. The applicant has also proposed to conduct this trial with rental payment as per STR Rates for utilization of land and payment of Electricity Bill on actual consumption. The applicant has also stated that this trial will improve connectivity of both 2G and 4G technology in the vicinity of Agra Cantt. and shall help to communicate seamlessly;

It is pertinent to mention that mobile phone/ cell phone network system within the Cantt. area is improper and many a times, due to very poor signal strength, the very purpose of cell phone facility is defeated. This office on 04.10.2019 initiated action against two illegal mobile towers H.No.169-A, Sultanpura, Agra Cantt. and these illegal towers were made non functional. As a result, the quality of Cell phone mobile system has further deteriorated and, such a situation is problem area for general public also. In this regard, apart from general complaints related to poor connectivity, representation dt.04.10.2019 from Sh.Kishan Kumar Goyal has been received wherein it has been informed that in the absence of mobile tower and the connectivity, the work of internet, digital transaction in Banks etc. has been badly affected. This issue has also been brought up with the CEO by Hon'ble MP, Agra & Hon'ble MLA, Agra (Minister U.P. State). Multiple complaints and discussions on the same with elected ward members have also been recorded. The problem is so grave that internet-based biometric machines installed in Cantt. Schools have practically become dysfunctional & attendance is not being registered properly.

All connected papers are place on the table for consideration.

#### **RESOLUTION:**

95. The PCB highlighted inaction by the CB on Station Headquarters letter No. 585018/17/COW/Q dt. 09.10.2019, related to the issue CEO apprised the Board that the Principal Directorate, Defence Estates, Central Command, Lucknow Cantt. vide letter dated 21.03.2018 returned the earlier proposal of the Board due to introduction of new policy dated 26.02.2018 on COW and according to the Board vide CBR No. 85 dated 30.07.2018 decided to invite fresh expression of interest as per new policy. The interests/expressions of interest received through e-tender were forwarded to LMA on 29.09.2018 and 12.02.2019 with the request to constitute Board of Officers. However, Station Headquarters, Agra Cantt. vide letter dated 09.10.2019, informed about 14 numbers of suitable locations for proposal installation of COW and not constituted B.O.O. Realization of the same would ensure requisite progress for installation of COW.

96. **SHAKTI NAGAR COLONY – TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP RIGHTS OF THE HOUSES CONSTRUCTED BY THE CANTONMENT BOARD AGRA UNDER “LOW INCOME GROUP HOUSING SCHEME” SPONSORED BY GOVT. OF INDIA IN THE YEAR 1954-57**

To consider the proposal of transfer of ownership rights to occupants of Shakti Nagar Colony as per Ministry of Urban Employment & poverty Alleviation New Delhi letter no. I-14024/8/97-H.II dated 15.5.1997. MoUA& E letter dated 15.5.1997 states that **“Local bodies are free to sell the houses outright or on a hire purchase basis to their low paid staff and “to that extent the Cantonment Boards are free to decide the sell the houses to the authorized employees”**.

It is informed to the Board that Dte., General, Defence Estates vide its letter number 70/VIP Ref. 26/Agra/C/DE/18 (FMS ID -61562) addressed to Principal Dte., DE, CC with copy endorsed to CEO Agra has informed that MOD vide ID No. 19 (49)/2018-D (Q&C) dated 26.6.2019 has requested the D.G., D.E. to forward the views of Agra Cantonment Board through Board Resolution considering the clarification from MoUA& Alleviation dated 15.5.1997 quoted above in para 1 in bold letters.

It is also informed to the Board that Shakti Nagar Housing colony is situated outside the Cantonment limits and a total of 108 quarters were constructed in the year 1962 by the Cantt. Board under the Low Income Group (LIG) Housing Scheme launched by the Govt. of India through the State Govt. during the period 1954-57. The land on which Shakti Nagar Colony is located admeasuring 129.51 bighas was transferred to the Cantt. Board by the State Govt. and is mutated in the name of Cantt. Board, Agra. The above mentioned quarters were constructed by the Cantt. Board by availing loan of Rs 6,40,000/- from the State Govt. and this loan has been repaid in full by the Board. The said quarters initially were allotted by the Cantt. Board as per the terms and conditions of the scheme largely to State Govt./Central Govt./PSU's/ Cantt. Board employees. Since the colony is located outside the Cantonment limits, the provisions of Cantt. Act, 2006 do not apply in this area.

Allottees of these quarters pay rent to Cantt. Board Agra. Rent of the quarters was last revised in 2001.

Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti through its members comprising of its residents had approached Hon'ble High Court of judicature at Allahabad by means of W.P. No. 42463 of 2004 challenging the enhancement of the rent of the houses in their possession belonging to the Cantonment Board, Agra. The said writ petition was decided vide judgment dated 13.11.2009 and the Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti was directed to represent their grievances relating to the transfer of the ownership as well as in the matter of enhancement of rent before the Cantt. Board.

In compliance to the decision of the Hon'ble High Court Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti had filed their representation before the Cantonment Board and the said representation had been rejected under the order of then Chief Executive Officer, Cantonment Board, Agra dated 09.03.2010.

Against the order of the CEO Agra dated 09.03.2010, the Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti had filed a fresh Writ Petition 25614 of 2010. Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad vide its order dated 22.10.2013 dismissed the said writ petition filed by the Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti, Agra and decided that the ownership and all rights of the colony vested with the Cantonment Board, Agra.

Against the order dated 22.10.2013 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad, Shakti Nagar Vikas Samiti had filed Special Leave Petition no. 3914/2014. Apex Court order dated 03.03.2014 stated that counsel for the petitioner sought permission to withdraw the special leave petition. The SLP was thus dismissed as withdrawn.

The Shakti Nagar quarters are assets of the Cantonment Board. The occupants have no right to transfer ownership, and all rights vest in the Cantonment Board, Agra. The Board can transfer ownership as has been upheld in the High Court order dated 22.10.2013 in W.P. No. 25614 of 2010.

It is also informed to the Board that in response to D.G., D.E. letter no. 70/41/C/L&C/82 dated 21.08.1989, Board agreed in principle to transfer ownership rights to its present occupants vide resolution no. VI dated 30.09.1989. Cantonment Board, Agra resolution no. VI dated 30.09.1989 was re-opened on 20.12.1989. Vide item no. VI dated 30.09.1989 and it was resolved that the word "present occupants whether they are allottees or occupiers" be read instead of "Authorize allottees/occupants".

The financial implication involved in transfer of ownership rights of the houses in question were also worked out by the Board and forwarded to D.G., D.E. vide office letter no. 53/Misc/CE/CBA/96 dated 28.12.1996 in response to D.G., D.E. letter no. 70/41/C/DE/89 (Vol. III) dated 20.10.1996.

Grievances relating to the transfer of the ownership had been disposed of under the order of the Chief Executive, Cantonment Board Agra order dated 09.03.2010 as mentioned in preceding para above. As per the records available with this office, the matter was not referred to the Board.

It is also informed to the Board that Ministry of Defence vide its letter No. 25 (5)/2007-D(Q&C) dated 17.12.2008 addressed to Shri R.K. Kanda, 8/1, Shakti Nagar Colony, Gwalior Road, Agra with copy endorsed to U.S, D (Q&M) has taken the decision with regard to transfer of ownership right to the effect that there is no need for the Cantonment Boards to part with their property. Letter is placed on the table for information of the Board.

Board may take decision in the matter. All connected papers are placed on the table.

**RESOLUTION:**

96. The PCB brought out that complete details with reference the agenda points have not been tabled. The details of authorised allottees/ occupants of 108 quarters, transfer of ownership rights if any done earlier, details of rent being charged/ revenue earned and encroachment & illegal/ unauthorised construction if any and other issues related to land needs to be brought out for passing a resolution. It was resolved that, this matter shall be discussed in length by CAC where details of case file shall be put up. Thereafter the matter shall be referred to the board for further necessary action.

97. **ESTABLISHMENT: NON PRACTICE ALLOWANCES TO RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER AND MEDICAL OFFICER (LADY DOCTOR):**

To consider letter dated 26.09.2019 received from RMO & MO vide which requesting for NPA in accordance with U.P. State Govt. letter No. 2/2019/ve.aa-2-08/Das-2019-01(M)/2019 dated 9<sup>th</sup> March,2019 @ 20% of Gross Salary which is not more than Rs.,2,37,500/- including NPA wef. 09.03.2019.

Board may consider the above mentioned letter.

All connected papers are placed on the table.

**RESOLUTION:**

97. A certificate from doctors be taken first on non practice outside before granting of allowances. Considered and approved as per agenda. However, it was resolved that this payment be made accordingly to priority wherein other previous liabilities of the board are duly covered.

98. **REQUEST FOR COMPOSITION OF UNAUTHORISED CONSTRUCTIONS IN RESPECT OF QUARTER NO.09, (GLR SY. NO.-321-B), AGRA CANTT. DR.KARAN MAHENDERU AND DR.SHIV MAHENDERU:**

Reference CBR No.84, dt.23.08.2019, vide which it was resolved to defer the matter to the next Board meeting alongwith connected details, such as court order and assessment of composition aspect. As per office report, an area measuring 2870.37 Sq.Ft. in the main bungalow building of Quarter No. 09(Sy. No. 321-B), Agra Cantt. as well as in the outhouse Block-A, is unauthorized construction for which the composition plans should be given by the applicants, as per the order/ judgment dt.23.08.2016 of the appellate authority in Appeal No.12/2017 Sh. Karan Mahenderu and another Versus Cantt. Board Agra and notice issued under Section 248 (1) CA 2006 bearing No.B/03, dt.13.07.2016 by the Cantt. Board Agra. The details of unauthorized construction area are as under;

a) Total covered area of main bungalow building of Quarter No.09, (Sy.No.321-B), Agra Cantt. is 65'9" x 56'6" = 3714.87. Sq.Ft.

b) Out of 3714.87 Sq.Ft., the following portions of the main bungalow building are as per the sanctioned building plan of the year 2004 vide CBR No.328 dt.03.12.2004;

Northern side verandah measuring 56'6" x 7'6" = 423.75 Sq.Ft.

Western side verandah measuring 58'3" x 7'6" = 436.87Sq.Ft.  
860.625 Sq.Ft.

As such, area of unauthorized construction in the building = 3714.84 Sq.Ft. — 860.625 Sq.Ft. = **2854.25 Sq.Ft.**

c) Outhouse Block No.A (at the North East corner) was sanctioned for area measuring 15'0" x 34'0" = 510.00 Sq.Ft., but at site the constructed area is 15'3" x 34'6" = 526.12 Sq.Ft. As such unauthorized construction area in Block-A outhouse = **16.12 Sq.Ft.**

d) One brick wall measuring 100 ft. long and 3'0" high towards South of main building. This wall is not within any covered area.

e) Total area of unauthorized construction = 2854.25 Sq.Ft. + 16.12 Sq.Ft. = **2870.37 Sq.Ft.**

Court order dt.24.12.2018 in O.S.No.1144 of 2018 Karan Mahenderu and another Versus Cantl. Board Agra alongwith other connected papers is placed on the table for consideration of Board.

### **RESOLUTION:**

98. The Vice President Dr. Pankaj Mahinderu & Elected Member Dr. Renu Mahinderu explained to the chair about the case of Qtr No. 09 (GLR Sy.No. 321 B). It was briefed by the Member Secretary that as per the notice under section 248 of CA 2006, upheld by the GOC-in-Chief in his order under section 340 CA 2006, calculation of unauthorized construction has been put up in the agenda side. The PCB opined that the matter is subjudice and there is a stay order against demolition. Hence it was unanimously resolved to reserve the final decision on this matter till legal proceeding are concluded. The composition plan may be returned to applicant.

### **DISCUSSION POINT:-**

- The date and timing for next meeting shall be intimated from the PCB office for discussion on Sl. No. 99 & 100 of the agenda.
- VP Dr. Pankaj Mahinderu brought out the point that damage charges should be charged from all illegal commercial activity installation. Elected Member Shri Durgesh Upadhyaya raised the issue of damage charges from those households where illegal mobile tower were placed for the period between their installation and the demolition by Cantonment Board office. The Member Secretary informed the board that damage charge are being issued to all defaulters and within two months, notices will be issued to each such defaulter.
- VP Dr. Pankaj Mahinderu raised the issue regarding removal of Chaat Gali and Chappal Gali. The CEO informed the board that encroachment drive has been carried out by Cantonment Board against encroachers in Naulakha and Sadar Bazar. Member Smt. Vijay Laxmi and Shri Dilip Kumar raise the point that these are temporary mobile stalls. However it was agreed these are encroachments and illegal and action taken by CEO is legally correct. CEO informed that Chaat and Chappal Gali are being shifted behind the Shopping arcade, as

principally agreed in the Committee for vending zone. Necessary steps are being taken for sensitizing the affected people and also about the said shift of the Chaat and Chappalgali.

- Vice President Pankaj Mahinderu brought out only Chaat Gali temporary vendors were paying Teh Bazari and being charged extra, in Teh Bazari. The receipts were shown. More over Court Order was already passed for shifting Chapal Gali which was not being touched and the vendors on Chaat Gali were being harassed. Moreover resolution was already passed to shift 07 Kiosks in front of Gopichand Shivare road which is on Teh Bazari and also to shift stalls which were first auctioned and later cancelled. It was directed by PCB that humanitarian angle be taken while taking out such drives and all actions be taken once proper arrangement are done to shift these stalls behind the Gopichand Shivhare road.
- The point to appoint Lt Col Deepak Maan (GE West) as Ex Officio member was discussed and passed,
- The PCB directed Chairman General Committee to complete all the sub-committee reports. Chairman General Committee Pankaj Mahinderu brought out that sub-committee visited trenching ground on 23 Nov 2019, although all members were informed in writing by CBA, the Chairman was not, still he attended the inspection of the trenching ground but the member secretary/CEO did not attend the inspection site with the sub-committee. The CEO informed that there was other urgent commitment due to which CEO was unable to reach the Trenching Ground. However, reps of CEO – the CE, both SI's were present on site. The PCB directed that all laid down office administrative/board meeting norms be adhered to.
- The Member Secretary brought about the point regarding CBLA wherein a new panel can be considered by the board. The PCB instructed to bring in the next meeting.
- The details of the anti-encroachment drive will be provided to PCB office separately.
